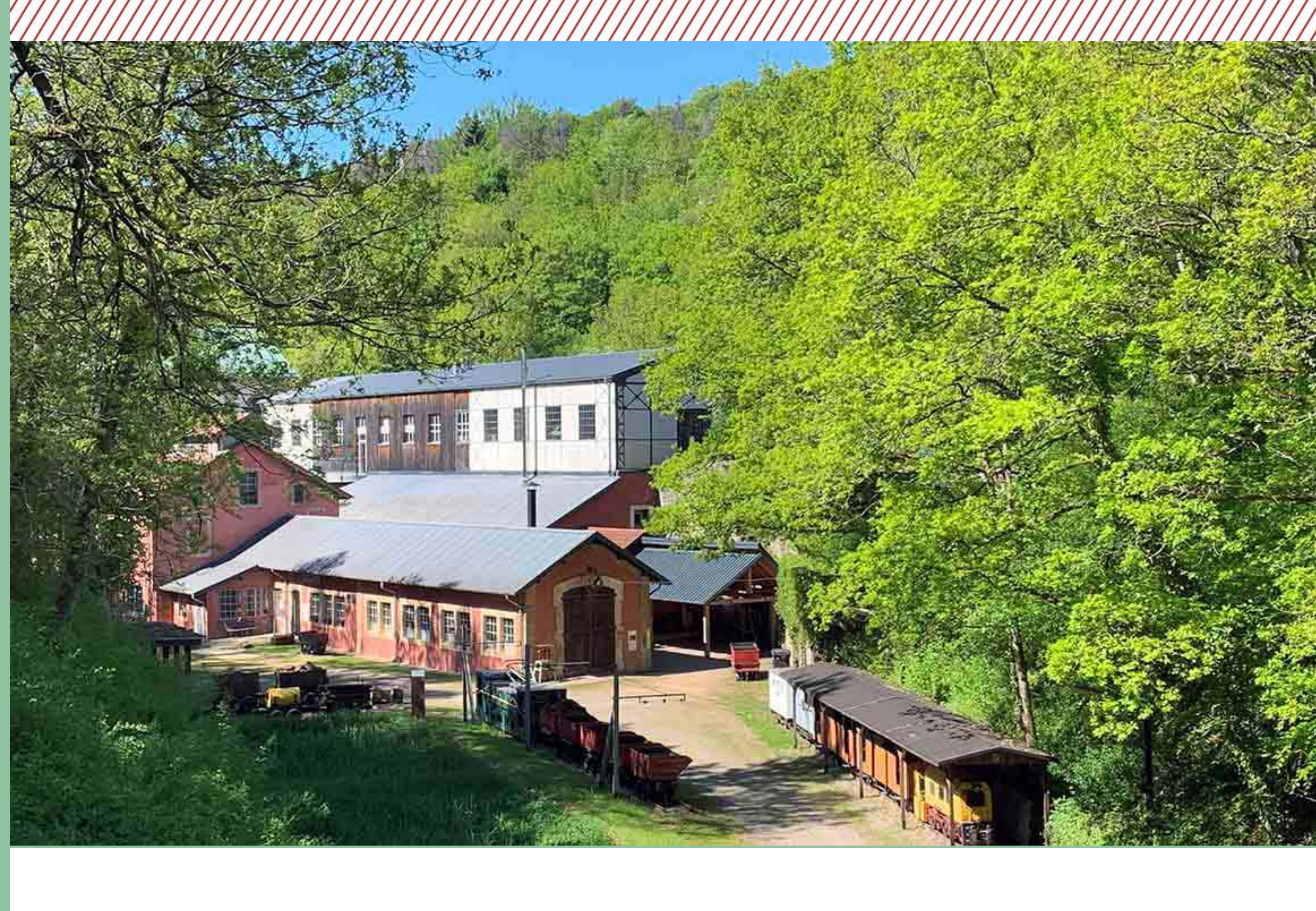

WORKSHOPS THIS SUNDAY



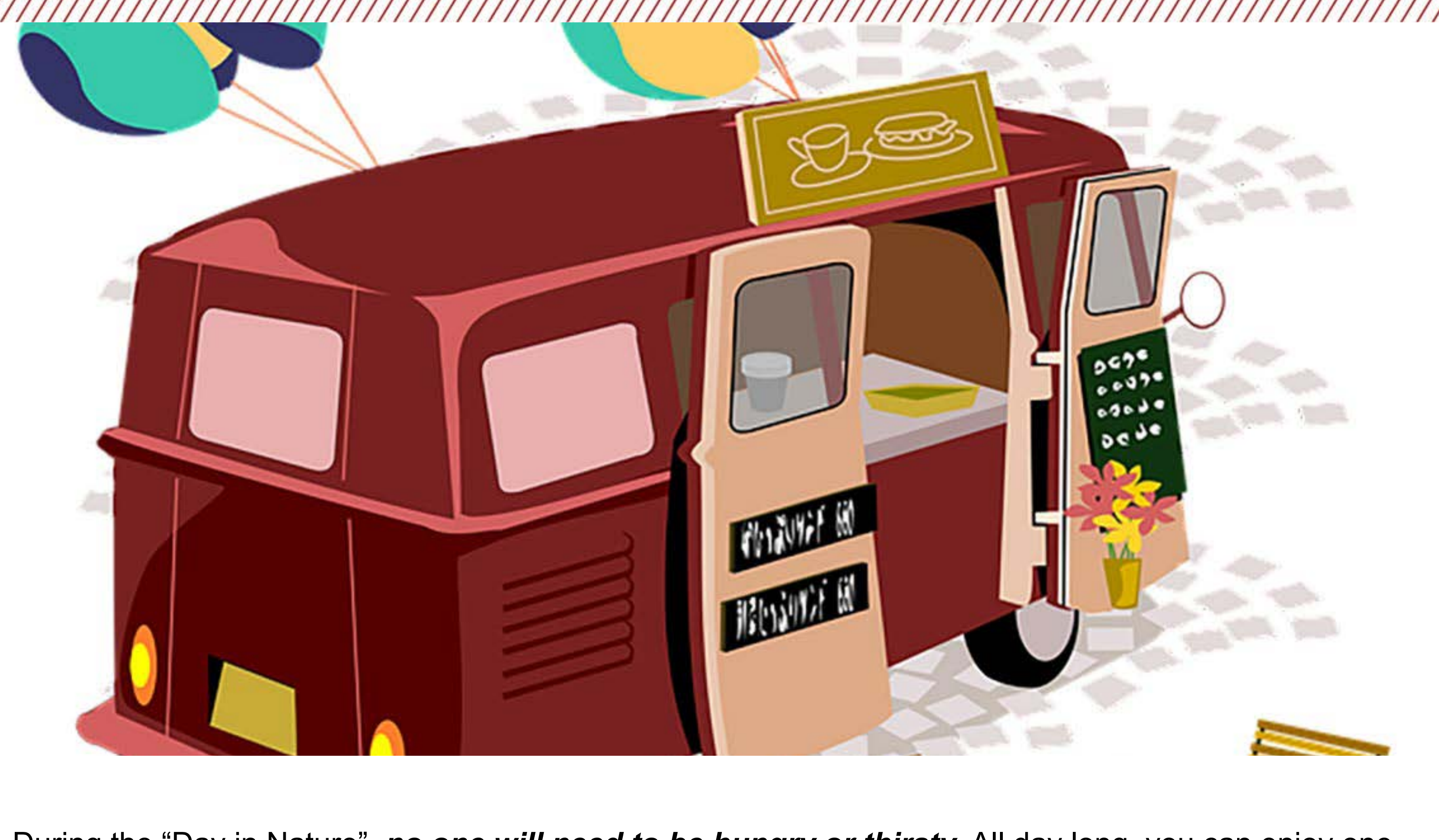
